Palm Springs Library Renovations

The Palm Springs Library at Baristo and Sunrise will close Aug. 8th for a major \$50+ million renovation, expected to take 2–3 years. A temporary library will open at Rimrock Plaza on Highway 111, offering around 25% of the library's most popular collection, limited computer access, and full access to the online collection. The renovation, which preserves the historic William Cody-designed structure, will include redesigned interior spaces and new outdoor areas to better support public use, without expanding the building's footprint. Bucks Program Returns! The Love Local Palm Springs digital gift card program is back for summer 2025, giving shoppers extra spending power at local businesses. Starting July 7, residents can purchase gift cards in amounts of \$100, \$200, or \$300, and the City will add 50% in bonus value—meaning a \$200 purchase becomes a \$300 card. The program supports local shopping and is limited to \$300 per

Opening Temporary Pickleball Courts at College of the Desert

Due to the expansion of Pickle ball courts at Demuth Park, the City of Palm Springs' Parks & Recreation Department (P&R) secured a 13month sublease to temporarily use three abandoned tennis courts at the College of the Desert (COD) campus on Baristo Road. The courts are being converted into 12 temporary Pickle ball courts, set to open in late August 2025. These courts will operate from 7am until dusk daily without utilities, restrooms, or campus parking, and will only be accessible from S Hermosa Drive with only street parking. The facility will close during COD events or exams. P&R will manage security and weekly maintenance. Director Nick Gonzalez emphasized the courts are a short -term solution and reiterated this is only a 13 month lease. Baristo Park Improvements Approved!

The City of Palm Springs City Council has approved \$537,210 for the Baristo Park Improvements project, as confirmed by the Measure J Oversight Commission.

Congratulations to the community for this success!

Next, City staff will determine whether the project will proceed as a grant to the community or be managed directly by the City. If processed as a grant, a detailed compliance review will be required, which may take time. The City will follow up soon with more information on next steps.





CV Link Project Nears Completion in Palm Springs

The CV Link project in Palm Springs, part of the 40-mile regional trail system across the Coachella Valley, is nearing completion. Construction on the Palm Springs segment began in July 2025, covering pathways from the

Palm Springs Visitor Center to the Whitewater River Stormwater Channel levee and along Tahquitz Creek. This portion is expected to be completed by late September 2025. The full CV Link trail—designed for pedestrians, cyclists, and low-speed electric vehicles—is projected to be substantially complete by the end of 2025, with final beautification work extending into 2026.
