ONE-PS "REFRESHES" WITH AGGRESSIVE AGENDA

NEW CHAIR & VICE CHAIR BUILD ON A SOLID FOUNDATION

How do you take a Really Good Thing and make it better? This is the challenge confronting ONE-PS' new leadership, **Chair Chris Reutz**, and **Vice-Chair Kate Castle**, both previously having served as At-Large board members. And they're responding to that challenge head-on.

At the year's first meeting, Chair Reutz highlighted four goals of for the coming year. 1) "Fill in the map" – nearly 7,000 residents live in an area of the city with no Neighborhood designation or representation. 2) Every NOrg should have a web presence, namely an internet site. One-PS will help the NOrgs with this. 3) Increase the number of blade signs in each neighborhood. The signs cost about \$150 each, and the city will install for free on an existing street sign. (The sign manufacturer will provide quantity discounts). 4) Standing Committees will be renamed "Community Forums" which will focus on issues most important to the City's residents.

also acknowledged that the remaining board members were from condominium developments.



- Joy Meredith spoke about <u>the popular One-PS Picnic to be held</u> on March 23 at Ruth Hardy Park. Baristo has already signed up


BARISTO BITS: THE SECTION 14 SPECIFIC PLAN

Do you know that the City of Palm Springs and the the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians worked together nearly ten years ago to develop a plan for Section 14 that would benefits both parties?

The plan was adopted by the City in July 2014, yet it remains the second-newest of all of the City's Specific Plans. Like the Housing Element of the General Plan, the Section 14 Plan is part of the City's General Plan, and is called out in its Land Use Element.

The Land Use Plan references the Section 14 Plan in two of its Goals: "Provide a logical transition between land uses and the built environment in Downtown and those proposed in the Section 14 Specific Plan", and "...to ensure that new development in Section 14 contributes to and enhances the City's goal of a destination resort."

We hope to learn more at our upcoming Annual Meeting (March 16).
